

What is Interpretation?

- Interpretation is ascertaining the sense of the Bible *text* by identifying the intent of the author using the evidence collected in Observation
- Three key phrases
 - ➤Sense of the Bible text
 - ≻Intent of the author
 - Evidence collected in Observation

Sense of the Bible text

- In linguistics, sense is one of the meanings of a word
- It is the idea that is intended
- A word often has many meanings, but only one is intended in every text
- Term: the word as used in a specific passage

Intent of the Author

- Critical piece
- What did the author have in his mind/heart to communicate and what did he/she want the audience to get
- Scriptures: authors communicating content to readers using written literature(form)
- Our job is to find out the author's intent(content), and not to tell the them what they should or should not have written

Evidence from Observation

- Interpretation should interpret the facts from the text
- This is the critical step and the pivot of the Inductive process
- Find the meaning of the facts in the text, not from facts which are not there
- Inductive Process: discipline of moving from facts to conclusions
- Deep revelations or truths from scriptures not supported by literary facts? NEVER!

Why Interpretation in the first place?

- Bible texts: written out of a culture that is strange to us and also thousand of years before us
- Scriptural texts are deep and thick in meaning
- Some passages are obvious by just reading and others require a systematic approach

Interpretive questions

- Interpretation is best carried out by answering questions
- Questions wake up the mind from sleep
- Interpretation answers questions raised during Observation
- Major literary evidences from Observation in
 - ≻Terms
 - ➤Structure
 - ≻Form
 - ≻Atmosphere

Observation-Interpretation link

- Interpretation is essentially seeking the meaning of the terms, structures, forms and atmosphere collected during Observation
- As noted in previous lessons, I often focus on terms and structures and sometimes form and atmosphere
- I want you to start with terms and structures to learn the basics and progress from there

Introduction to the Interpretive process

- Introduction only for the sake of this course with basics that will allow you to start the process right away
- As you start, further need for more will arise and will encourage you to consult appropriate resources to learn more
- Two major aspects to cover: general phases of interpretation and types of evidences to use

Major phases of Interpretation

- Three phases of Observation
- I go through them every time for the past 15 years at least!
- Phases
 - 1. Definitive
 - 2. Rationale
 - 3. Implicational

Definitive phase

- Discovering the basic meaning of the particulars of the passage as collected in Observation
- Defining the meaning of terms and explaining the structures you noted
- Questions:
 - ≻What does the term mean?
 - >What does this structural relationship such as contrast mean?

Definitive phase example

- Therefore being justified by faith.....(Romans 5:1)
- What is the meaning of the term justified here?
 > Being justified: verb, aorist, passive, participle, plural
- The term "therefore" is a conjunction, logical meaning structure: it serves as a logical conjunction
- Your tasks is: what is the meaning of this logical inferential conjunction?
- It is telling you there is a relationship between Rom 5:1 and the last verses of Romans 4

The Rational Phase

- Asking the "why" questions
- After clarifying the meaning of the author
- Rom 5:1

≻Why do we need to be justified?

- ≻Why are we justified by faith?
- >Why is Paul even saying this here ?

Implicational phase

- Every statement always implicates more than it says explicitly
- There are other truths that are connected what what is being said
- Implicational question: what does this imply?
- Rom 5:1,if we have therefore being justified by faith, what does this imply?
 - ≻If we have been justified by faith, we do not need to be justified any more
 - Faith in Christ is so powerful that it can make a person to be justified before God
 etc

Practice makes perfect

- Before getting into any thing more complex, these are the basics you should begin with
- Discipline yourself to go through this phases always
- Write the questions and the answer down!
 - What does justify mean in this verse: your answer
 - What is the meaning of the logical inference implied by "therefore"? Your answer
 - Why this or that?
 - What are the implications
- You should to this during your devotions or more in-depth Bible studies

How do you answer the Interpretive questions?

- Two major categories of determinants
 - 1. The person
 - 2. Objective criteria
- The Person: remember the two "S" from the first lesson of this course
 - Spirit: Holy Spirit's influence
 - Skill: sound exegetical skills, experience
- Objective: many determinants
 - Interpretation is not based on what you think
 - It is based on literary evidences that justify the conclusions

Listing of Interpretive determinants

- Listing here for brevity: please study more as needed
- Preliminary definition : Dictionaries, Lexicons
- Literary context: what comes before and after, literary structure, use of the term elsewhere in the book
- Word usage: use of a term outside of the Biblical book, and sometimes extra-biblical
- Scriptural testimony: topical bibles such as the Nave's to finding similar passages dealing with the same subject

Listing of Interpretive determinants

- Kinds of terms: literal and figurative
- Inflections and Syntax: grammatical structure
- Historical background, history of terms
- History of the text(finding the original form, text criticism)
- Commentaries: important to consult, do it at the end!
 - Logos Basic, blue letter Bible, Bible study tools,
